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## Pupil Premium Funding Report 2014-2015

Pupil Premium is Government funding given to the school to support disadvantaged children. In 2014-15 it will be linked to the number of statutory school aged children in our school who had been registered for Free School Meals (FSM) at any point in the last six years. The school is able to decide how to allocate the money to ensure that our current vulnerable and disadvantaged children make the best possible progress.

In the academic year **2014- 2015** we have received £19717 Pupil Premium to date.

This funding is used to enhance provision and outcomes for identified children in the following ways. (Projected costings)

- Financial support for children on FSM to take part in school residentials to Ufton Court, PGL and France as well as other educational day visits.
- Access to an After School Homework club on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday; the club is based in our ICT suite and it enables children to use the school computers to complete their homework with staff support. (£500)
- Part funding the post of a Parent Support Advisor to work with parents of targeted pupils in order to support pupil learning and home/school partnership. (£1500)
- Nurture Assistant provision for targeted individuals. (£2634)
- Part funding of Nurture group provision for targeted Year 1 group. (£2000)
- Additional Teaching Assistant hours in Year 1 and 2 to support individual learning and behaviour plans. (£8950)
- Financial support for music and sports activities for specific individuals. (£975 + £500)
- Teaching Assistant hours to provide interventions for specific children including Rapid writing in Y4, Rapid writing, reading and Maths Y5. (£7500)
- Occupational therapy support for individual children in Y2 and Y4. (£2750)
- School uniform (£50)

## **Review of 2013 - 2014**

In the academic year 2013- 2014 we received £26,683. This funding was used to enhance provision and outcomes for identified children in one or more of the following ways.

- Access to an After School Homework club on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday; the club is based in our ICT suite and it enables children to use the school computers to complete their homework with staff support.
- Financial support for children on FSM to take part in school residentials to Ufton Court, PGL and France as well as other educational day visits.
- One to one sessions for specific children.
- Part funding the post of a Parent Support Advisor to work with parents of targeted pupils in order to support pupil learning and home/school partnership.
- Nurture group provision for targeted individuals.
- Additional Teaching Assistant to support identified Foundation Stage 2 pupils in preparation for their transition to Year 1.
- Specific Occupational Therapy resources.
- Additional Teaching Assistant hours in Year 1 and 2 to support additional phonics and reading.
- Financial support for music and sports activities for specific individuals.

## **Outcomes for Pupil Premium Pupils 2014**

Our tracking and evaluation systems indicate that the use of provisions funded by pupil premium money has resulted in improved access to our integrated curriculum for all children; accelerated rates of progress for children involved in one to one sessions and improved partnership with parents/carers to support pupil progress.

During 2013-2014 children in receipt of Pupil Premium made on average 5.1 points progress in Key Stage 1 compared to non-pupil premium pupils who made 5.5 points progress.

Children in receipt of Pupil Premium at Key Stage 2 made on average 4.0 points progress compared to non-pupil premium pupils who made on average 4.6 points progress.

100% of Y6 Pupil Premium children who took end of Key Stage 2 assessments in 2014 achieved a level 4 or above for reading, writing and Mathematics.
